Executive Director Message

Since I moved into the role of Executive Director in early January, there have been many exciting moments, and I have learned something new each and every day. Despite being a small organization, Youville Centre provides many great programs for the young women and children who come to us for services. After one of the coldest weekends of the winter, our Child Development Program staff were greeted early Monday morning with gushing water from a frozen and burst pipe in the children's dining room. The staff quickly worked together to make the area safe to welcome families and ensure there were no interruptions to services. Our Child Development Program Manager, Diana, was able to secure a temporary child care license and staff turned the gym into an alternate toddler program during the emergency repair. The staff will continue to work creatively together during the next phase of the repair to ensure we are able to continue to meet the needs of our children and families.

We are also in the beginning stages of work for the Roof & HVAC Project, with the majority of construction happening between May to August. While we know there will be disruptions, we will continue to work together as a team to navigate the construction process.

We continue to reach out to community partners to establish relationships and seek new funding opportunities. I am very proud to be the Executive Director and work with the dedicated team of staff and volunteers to help our clients create a brighter future, for themselves and their children.

Ujima Project at Youville Centre

Liz Briggs, the Early Literacy Specialist, provides resources and support to young moms whose children are on waitlists for speech and language assessment. Assistance completing the First Words Communication Checkup as well as ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE is also provided. Ideas and activities are offered to support language development and play opportunities at home.

In partnership with Rural Family Connections EarlyON agency, Liz facilitated the First Word's Chat Room Playgroup program. This 7-week program was offered at Rural Family Connection's Metcalfe location with Erin Smith, RECE. It was well attended and the feedback received was very positive.

As a new initiative Liz has begun small group "Talking About" sessions and drop in circle times with Youville students and their children. These sessions are being offered every second week and topics vary depending on the students interests and children's needs.

Coming up:

- Starting in May, in partnership with Mothercraft Ottawa, Liz will be facilitating a 4-week version of the Chat Room Program. This will be offered virtually to parents and caregivers of children from birth to 4 years of age.
- Talking About sessions will be offered virtually to Youville's Child Development Program (CDP) community families.
- CDP Educators Reflective practice sessions will resume and be offered virtually. Upcoming topics may include: Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health; Move to Learn: How Movement Supports Brain Development; Supporting Happy Eaters in Childcare Programs; Trauma Sensitive Child Development Programs

Samar El Faki joined our team as our new Family Navigator in February, and is assisting families in system navigation, advocacy, referrals and supportive services within the community.



Canada Wide Early Learning and Child Care agreement (CWELCC)

Youville Centre is very excited to be enrolled in the Canada Wide Early
Learning and Child Care agreement. In its early stages, eligible families have been issued applicable refunds and are now paying reduced fees. With increased affordability of licensed child care, the next stages will include increased access with a focus on workplace retention and recruitment in the early years sector. The Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) system supports quality, accessibility, affordability and inclusivity in licensed child care.

CWELCC is a five-year plan that is being implemented in stages, to make child care more accessible and affordable. Fees will reduce every year, reaching an average fee of \$10/day by 2025-2026.

- Create more affordable, quality licensed child care spaces;
- Support the early childhood workforce through enhanced compensation, training, and professional learning opportunities;
 and
- Improve accessibility by addressing barriers to providing inclusive and flexible child care.

Professional Learning Pilot

The Professional Learning Pilot is a new opportunity as part of a Child Care and Early Years Workforce Program for Ottawa. Our Professional Learning Leader, Sophie Rayner-Grignon, plays an important role in delivering staff learning and development and mentorship in the four identified priority areas to increase quality and responsiveness within the child care and early years system. Each week Sophie creates an internal newsletter to share highlights of the ongoing professional learning opportunities, upcoming training and spotlights on ECE pedagogy. Staff are able to access training materials, resources and learning through our CDP Padlet. On March 17th, as a result of this pilot, the entire Child **Development Team participated** in a full day of professional **learning**. (pictured below) Educators and program staff engaged together to learn and focus on leadership and capacity building.

Child Development Program Updates

Our Child Development Program is operating at capacity, providing early learning and care to 70 children each day. In our 4 Infant programs, we recognize that infants are curious little beings that want to connect with the world around them. Infants learn through experiences and relationships so supporting infants' natural discovery, exploration and a sense of belonging is a focus of our infant programs. The Educators reflect on each infant's individual development and interests to ensure inclusive programming and planning. In our 2 toddler programs, curiosity and discovery are still an essential part of the day but with a new element of more structure and routine in their days. We encourage group activities and open-ended play opportunities for toddlers to connect with their community and build social skills. We offer a variety of programming and supervise low-level risky play allowing toddlers to experiment with the abilities of their bodies.

Our CDP Team continues to strive for innovative ways to share and document the children's development and learning and create a sense of community. The **Living Learning Wall**, (pictured below) a form of pedagogical documentation, is in its early stages at Youville Centre. The Living Learning Wall supports the notion of a "curriculum-as-lived experience" that honours children and gives them a voice through collection and interpretation of their artwork, dialogue & imaginative play scripts.







Intensive Treatment Support Program Update

The Intensive Treatment Support Program (ITSP) Team has been busy with many activities and special events. Since the new year, clients continue to engage with ITSP services and treatment groups have resumed. We are grateful to be able to provide our clients with access to on-site supports from community partners such as Ontario Works, LEAP, Dr. Harrison from CHEO, Ottawa Food Bank, iSisters, and Famous 5 Lunch n' Learn activities.

As the spring weather arrives, and with summer around the corner, clients are preparing to wrap up their school year, with graduation approaching for many.


