CWELCC Agreement

Ontario was recently one of the 11 provinces to extend the Canada Wide Early Learning and Child Care Funding agreement. In January 2025, parent fees were reduced to \$22 per day and will continue to be reduced to an average of \$10 per day. A cost based funding model to provide more financial stability to the sector has been introduced with a goal of increasing the recruitment and retention of the childcare workforce. While our clients typically qualify for subsidy support, this is great news for our alumnae, staff, local workforce and our community.

After 3 years and many impacted families, the UJIMA project has





Museum Field Trip


The students and staff explored a tropical visit inside the Canadian Museum of Nature's Butterfly Exhibit




Fairy Godmother

Breakfast Club

Thanks to a grant provided by Ottawa Food Bank, a breakfast club was created to accompany the ONFE Breakfast Program. The club is used to provide activities and resources related to food security and nutrition, along with increasing food security by distributing grocery gift cards to participating clients.





Circle Time - Due to a high interest in wanting opportunities to engage with their children while onsite, Case Coordinator Liz offers a parent-child circle time on Fridays. The groups are divided into 2 age groups, with a focus on connection, attachment and reading your baby's cues...no singing experience is required.

Parenting - Sophie, an RECE in the Daffodil Infant Room, is pictured meeting with a group of students to talk about introducing solids to their babies, for an informal lunch and learn session.



Balancing School and Family Life

Our students continue to juggle the challenges of being both learners and parents, but they are doing so with incredible strength. Their commitment to their studies and families is a testament to their resilience as they work hard to graduate and continue on their chosen path.

Transitions Group

As students prepare to graduate and transition into the next phase of their lives, we are excited to offer valuable support through our 8-week Transition Group for graduating students, designed to support their journey into chosen pathways. This program includes a personalized tour of Algonquin College, showcasing its programs and services. Students will also hear from two employment programs, Operation Come Home and Causeway Work Centre, to learn about job skill-building and job search support. Additionally, key topics like OSAP, Ontario Works, budgeting, and financial literacy will be covered to equip students with essential life skills.

New Food & Nutrition Class

We're excited to introduce a new Food and Nutrition class for the remainder of the school year. Students are gaining practical skills in making healthy food choices and understanding

making healthy food choices and understanding the role of nutrition in overall well-being. Topics include:

- Canada's Food Guide: Understanding food groups, serving sizes, and key nutrients.
- **Meal Planning:** Learning to plan meals for specific dietary needs, manage food budgets, and prepare meals in advance.
- Food Labels: Interpreting nutrition facts to make informed choices.
- **Eating Patterns:** Exploring the benefits of nutrient-dense foods, healthy snacking, and the importance of a balanced breakfast.
- Influences on Food Choices: Analyzing how factors like culture, emotions, media, and social situations impact what we eat.

This course empowers students to apply nutrition knowledge to their daily lives, equipping them with essential skills for healthy eating.
